REGION I GATHERING

June 21-23, 2013

It was a blessing to attend this year's Women of the ELCA Region 1 Gathering held on June 21-23, 2013 at the Heathman Lodge, Vancouver, Washington.

There were over 200 women in attendance. The speakers were inspirational and their stories filled with humor. Keynote speaker Jane Kirkpatrick, author, shared the importance of family history and transferring stories through your experience. Dr. Kay Ward introduced the 2013-2014 *Gather Magazine* Bible Study: *In Good Company: Stories of Biblical Women*. She asked if we knew the meaning of handwork = meaning keeping hands busy. In the "old days" darning, ironing, folding clothes, etc. was justification for watching television at the same time. She also asked what do you think of when you are expecting to have company. To be with friends, eating and breaking bread together, enjoying others. In the "old days" first thought was "must clean house" and everyone was expected to help with the chores.

We were encouraged to "Love what you are doing and it will take you out of yourself. Lose your worry and find your joy."

Excerpts from July SWATCH

"Now just a memory. But what wonderful memories!"

Keynote speaker, Jane Kirkpatrick, author of several historical fiction books, delighted the women with her stories and her quotes. (How can she remember all of those things?)

Bishop Kay Ward was a most inspiring speaker. Even though she claimed she did not speak “Lutheran”, Kay spoke about her experience writing the study for the Lutheran women’s *Gather* magazine, told about her life as Moravian woman, mother, wife, pastor, teacher and shared some “secrets” with the audience. She encouraged women to start with a Psalm when studying the lessons.

Terri Lackey, managing editor of *Gather* was in attendance and was available for chats and to learn more about social media. *Gather* Leader Guides and Companion Bibles were available to purchase. Women will enjoy reading the Leader Guide all by itself and it will be a great tool for studying and leading the monthly lessons.

The workshop on the trip to Liberia was the most well attended. Women wanted to hear about this trip! Other workshops were Racial Justice Advocacy, Financial Planning for Women, Growing Leaders, A Thoughtful Prayer Life (prayer beads).”

SW WA SWO Convention Business

The Churchwide Executive Board, Women of the ELCA, at its meeting on October 20, 2012 approved the proposed amendment to Article VII, Section 6, Item 1 of the Southwestern Washington Synodical Women’s Organization (SW WA SWO) constitution. The approved new language is as follows: There shall be **5 members** of the board elected by the convention of the synodical women’s organization for a term of two years. Each board member shall be a participant in a unit and a member of the

ELCA. (ELCA board reduced from 7 to 5.) Second reading approved.

The above amendment change will also result in a change to Article VII, Section 1, Item 1. The approved new language is as follows: There shall be a board of this synodical women’s organization consisting of the four elected officers together with **5 elected members**. As nearly as possible at least 10 percent of the board members shall be persons of color and/or persons who primary language is other than English, and no more than one officer or board member shall come from the same unit.

Therefore, at this convention, June 22, 2013, this first reading of the proposed change is presented to the delegates in writing. The second reading is to be presented to the 2014 convention and if adopted by a two thirds vote, it will pass and be an approved constitutional change.

MIRACLE IN THE LODGE

Lynn Coffman, President of the North Mason Coalition of Churches & Community, reports that over 5,000 pieces of food go out of the Lodge each Tuesday as 105 "Backpack Kids" plus their 20 preschool siblings are fed each week of the Summer School Break.

This is a significant increase from Summer of 2012, when 99 Backpack kids and siblings were fed each week with boxes of food delivered weekly.

Thrivent and our generous community provide most of the funds, volunteers donate time and gas for deliveries, and Christ Lutheran provides the site for this to happen to feed hungry kids in the North Mason area.

Want to help? Food donations can be placed in the "grocery cart" and \$\$\$ for NMCCC Summer Boxes can be put in the offering, or given to Monna Haugen to be deposited.

Many thanks to CLC for allowing this to take place in the Lodge, to the Quilters who generously share their space, and to ALL the volunteers from our church who acquire 100's of boxes, shop, and otherwise contribute so much to this effort!



ALTAR GUILD/ SACRISTY

What is altar guild? Altar guild is not just a bunch of women who take turns setting up for communion each Sunday, nor is it like participating in a social group or committee. It is a ministry dedicated to Christ for what He has done for us, and continues to do. We are **MINISTERS OF GOD**: Our work is done joyfully and prayerfully. Joy is a natural response to God's presence which enables the work of the altar guild to be carried out with a sense of praise, privilege and reverence. We are **MINISTERS OF GOD'S PEOPLE**: guild members/sacristans are to be sensitive to how their work affects other people in the congregation. We are **MINISTERS OF THE LITURGY**: This ministry involves preparing the worship space with

the furnishings, appointments, vessels, elements, linens, and paraments used in the service. Members of altar guild/sacristans have several basic responsibilities. Housekeeping is to be carried out with the attitude that it is a privilege to care for the things that represent God's love and presence. We are responsible for keeping the chancel, altar, font and pulpit clean and free of clutter. Linens, paraments and vestments are to be clean and pressed. Sacramental vessels and other appointments are to be kept clean and polished. Adequate supplies of bread, wine and other necessities are to be on hand and properly stored. We are **MINISTERS OF THE WORSHIP SPACE**: we are entrusted with the privilege of preparing the worship space for the gathering of God's family. Meaningful worship does not just happen but requires thorough preparation. This involves care and placement of the furnish-

ings, appointment and ornaments used in worship. The overall goal of the altar guild/sacristy is to see that the worship space is kept beautiful and in good order, both to glorify God and to provide a setting that helps enable the congregation to worship in a meaningful way.

The terms altar guild members and sacristans are synonyms and neither is better than the other. Right now, we don't have any men as members and we can easily change the name to sacristans if you feel altar guild sounds too feminine. Men are as welcome as women to take part in this important ministry. If you feel that God is calling you to serve CLC as a member of altar guild or if you want more information contact Jan Jensen for a big smile and personal training.


